

2025 Summer Law Fellowship Application

For the summer of 2025, the Williams Institute will hire 1 to 2 Summer Law Fellows. Law Fellows will have the opportunity to learn about and engage in research related to LGBTQ law and policy with Williams Institute scholars. The Fellowship is a mentorship and learning experience that will provide students with exposure to public policy, legal research, writing, and LGBTQ rights.

The Fellowship will be for a period of eight weeks between June 1 to August 31, 2025, of the student's choosing. Summer Law Fellows may work remotely or in person at the Williams Institute's office in Los Angeles, CA.

Criteria for Selection

Applicants must be current law students (1L, 2L, 3L, or LLM). The Selection Committee will consider the following when evaluating applications: a) academic record; b) research and writing abilities; and c) demonstrated commitment to public interest and social justice, especially focused on sexual orientation or gender identity law and policy issues.

Application

Funding

Summer Law Fellows will be paid a stipend of \$6,000 for eight weeks.

This year's application deadline is February 8, 2025, but applicants will be considered on a rolling basis, so early applications are recommended.
